





Dear Families,

Thank you to all our families who have supported our school through fundraisers such as special lunches and Cookie Grams, and for those who volunteer their time at Westney Heights. Your support is greatly appreciated and helps to run programs and special events for our students.

Throughout the month our students have been working on communicating their thinking in math in many ways. We've seen kindergarten students share how they measure objects using lots of different items, grade 2 students showing their understanding using FlipGrid on the computer and Grade 8s beginning "Math Life," where they learn all the ways math skills are needed in life as you become an adult. The grade 8s receive a job and salary and learn to budget, pay rent, buy a house, pay interest and support a family. Amazing learning is happening all around Westney!

Every Wednesday and Friday afternoon Mrs. Robertson or Mr. Harney read a story in the library for all who would like to attend. These read alouds are very well attended across the grades, usually with more than 50 students coming to listen to a variety of stories. We're thrilled to continue this through the rest of the school year.



Parent Portal

It is extremely important that all Westney families have updated their information on the DDSB Parent Portal. This includes up to date phone numbers and email addresses. It can be a challenge to contact parents or guardians in the event of a student illness if the contact information is not up to date. We also send out a number of information items including our school newsletter via email which makes it

important to have current email addresses as well. This can be done throughout the school year as contact information changes. We truly appreciate your efforts to stay connected with the school.

Volunteers in School

Thank you to all of our volunteers who have received a criminal background check in order to volunteer at Westney Heights. If you are volunteering in classrooms, driving for teams or clubs, or support field trips with our students we require that you have a criminal background check that is current within three years. We have a letter in the office that you can bring to a Durham Regional Police Service location for a discounted fee. We truly appreciate our volunteers and continue to put the safety of our students first. Because of the involvement of our volunteers we continue to be able to provide additional experiences that would otherwise not be available. Thank you to all of our amazing volunteers!

[**Dogs at Westney Heights**](#)

We would like to thank all of our families who continue to take the opportunity to walk to and from Westney on a regular basis. We know that this is a great way to promote physical activity which often involves bringing the family dog along for the walk. This was clearly communicated to us with the survey that went home last spring that the majority of families do want to continue with the practice of allowing dogs on school property.

Once at school we continue to ask that if you bring your dog to school that you remain at a safe distance from the doorways to allow those who are fearful or not comfortable around dogs to remain at a distance that they feel comfortable. Additionally, we ask that you are aware in walkways and sidewalks to keep your dog at close proximity. During the winter months with snowbanks often reducing the width of these routes, be aware that those that are not comfortable around dogs have less room to keep at a distance to feel comfortable.

Kiss and Ride




Once again, we need your help to ensure the safety of all of our students. We ask that if you are dropping off or picking up your child in person to please use our Kiss and Ride program.

Please keep the following in mind when using the kiss and ride:

1. The kiss and ride is for picking up and dropping off only. Please do not park your vehicle to enter the school or supervise your child on the playground. This creates a traffic jam for other people who are using it.
2. Between 8:45 - 9:00 and 3:30 - 3:45, please do not drive through parking lot area unless you are using the kiss and ride.
3. Please enter at the west entrance and exit at the east entrance on Brennan.
4. Please do not park on the student crosswalk. This area is marked with yellow lines and is used for students to walk along.
6. Please do not park in the parking lot or driveway. Please use side streets if possible to reduce the number of vehicles on Brennan at or near bell times, and please do not park on Nicholls Crt.
7. Marked accessibility parking spaces are only to be used with a permit. We have a number of students who require loading and unloading in these areas.
8. Please remember that Smoking and Vaping is prohibited on school property or within 20m of school property. Please do not smoke or vape in your vehicle or outside of your vehicle while on school property.

Your assistance in this area is greatly appreciated and necessary to ensure the safety of all of our students!

March is Bangladeshi Heritage Month

Ontario is home to a large and vibrant Bangladeshi community. Across our province, Bangladeshi Canadians people have made significant contributions to science, athletics, and cultural and political development.

March 8th - International Women's Day

International Women's Day is celebrated around the world. Established in 1977 by the United Nations, this special day is an excellent opportunity to recognize the contributions to social justice and international peace and security that have been made by women. March 8th also provides an opportunity to reflect on the progress made to advance women's equality, to assess the challenges facing women in contemporary society, to plan steps to enhance the status of women, and to celebrate the gains made in these areas. The theme for this year is 'Generation Equality: Realizing Women's Rights'. March 17th - St. Patrick's Day (Irish)/Irish Heritage Day

Irish immigrants were among the earliest settlers in Canada. In 1845, Irish immigrants, fleeing the potato famine in Ireland, began settling in Ontario in large numbers. They brought to Ontario and Canada their values of hard work, devotion to family, service to the community and the perpetual hope for a better future for themselves and their fellow citizens. Ontario citizens of Irish descent made significant contributions to the founding of Canada. They have made and continue to make significant contributions to the development of Canada, especially over the more than 150 years since the first large waves of Irish immigration. It is important to recognize and celebrate those contributions. Today the rich cultural heritage of Canada's Irish community is an integral part of Canadian national culture and identity and belongs, by right, to all Canadians of all backgrounds. As evidence of that fact, the coat of arms of Canada bears several symbols of Irish heritage: the Royal Harp of Tara representing the historic coronation place of the High King or Ard Righ of Ireland and the Shamrock and Cross of Saint Patrick. It is

appropriate to recognize March 17, the day of Saint Patrick, the patron saint of the Irish, as Irish Heritage Day in Ontario. Taken from: <https://www.ontario.ca/laws/statute/s04010>

March 21st - United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racism Beginning in 1966, the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination has been observed annually on March 21st around the world. On this day in 1960, police opened fire and killed 69 people at a peaceful demonstration against apartheid "pass laws" in Sharpeville, South Africa. This incident provoked outrage and an increased desire to see racial discrimination of allsorts eliminated. March 19 - Naw Ruz (New Year) This is the first day of the year in the Baha'i calendar according to the Vernal or Spring Equinox. This day represents the new life of Spring and marks the end of the 19-day period of fasting.

March 25th - International Day of Remembrance - Victims of Slavery and Transatlantic Slave Trade

For over 400 years, more than 15 million men, women and children were the victims of the tragic transatlantic slave trade, one of the darkest chapters in human history. Every year on 25 March, the International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade offers the opportunity to honour and remember those who suffered and died at the hands of the brutal slavery system. The International Day also aims to raise awareness about the dangers of racism and prejudice today. In order to more permanently honour the victims, a memorial has been erected at United Nations Headquarters in New York. The unveiling took place on 25 March 2015. The winning design for the memorial, The Ark of Return by Rodney Leon, an American architect of Haitian descent, was selected through an international competition and announced in September 2013.
